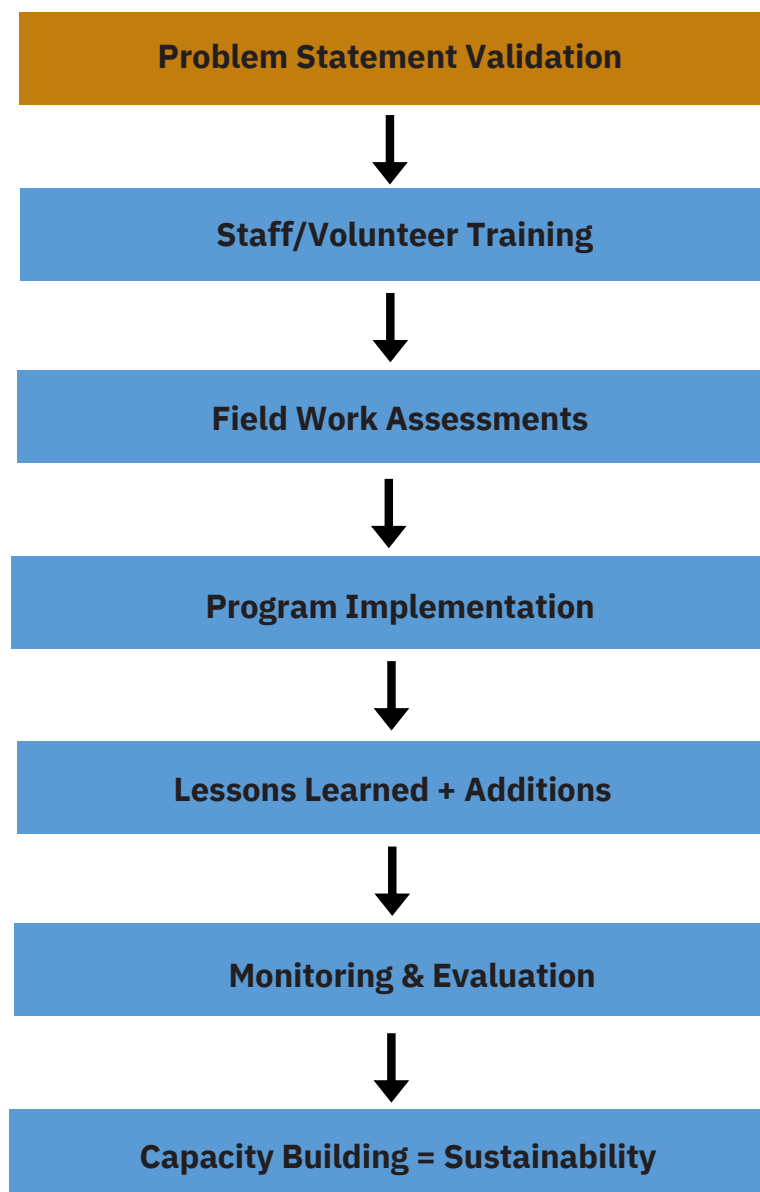

### Program # 1: Mend the Gap Schooling Program for Vulnerable Ebola Orphans & Survivors (MDG) – (2016 – On-going)

**Location:** Sierra Leone, Cameroon, Nigeria, Guinea Conakry

- **Focus:** Support with School fees, Learning materials, and skills training to EVD orphans, psychosocial services to orphans, Survivors, and Caregivers

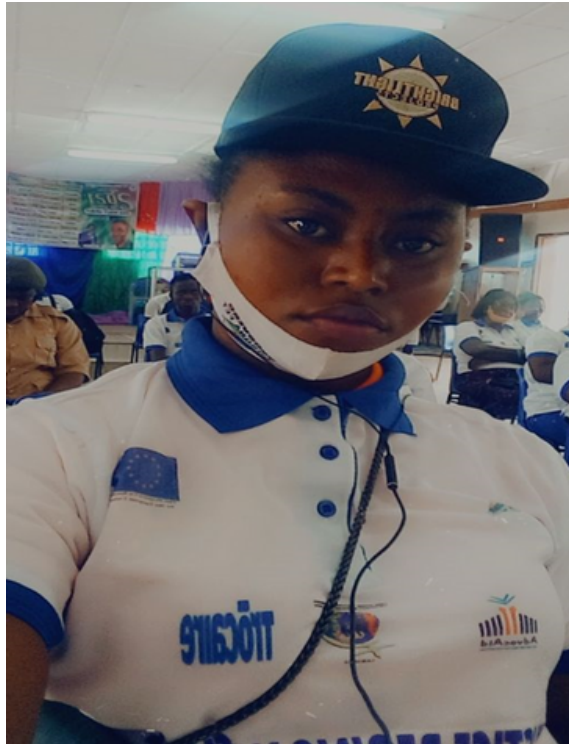

### **PRIORITY STRATEGIC GOALS FOR BLP FIVE YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN (2021 – 2026)**
